Sadly our whole school attendance for the last academic year has fallen to its lowest level since 2010/2011. Children 'who regularly miss school...are more likely to become isolated from their friends, to underachieve...and/or become involved in anti-social behaviour' (taken from Department of Education Parent's Guide on School Attendance). The Department of Education considers 95% attendance as only satisfactory and 90% as poor. 90% attendance means your child has missed 3 weeks and 4 days of learning in the school year! Schools have a legal responsibility to report any pupil whose absence falls below 85% to the Education Welfare Officer.
