# New Year, new start—Healthy Breaks

We would like to remind all children and parents of our healthy eating guidelines for breaktime, taken from the Department of Education's Food in Schools Policy: Children may bring:

### fruit or vegetables

Not suitable - fruit tinned in syrup, dried fruit (eg raisins, sultanas) and processed fruit bars (eg fruit winders, fruit flakes etc). These are high in sugar and can cause tooth decay.

### bread based snacks

This includes white or wholemeal bread, rolls or baquettes, plain bagels, wheaten, soda, potato or pitta bread, spread thinly with a little margarine, low-fat spread or butter; plain bread sticks or crackers, a small sandwich with a sugar-free filling such as tomato, tuna, chicken, cheese. Not suitable - Sugary spreads, including jam, honey, marmalade or chocolate spread as these are harmful to teeth. Peanut butter is high in fat and salt so is not recommended. No cereal bars, or sweetened breads and pastries, eg pancakes, fruit bread, malt loaf, brioche, croissants and Danish pastries as these contain a lot of sugar and/or fat and salt.
